Preface

It was a year where the Corona Virus took the main role. It changed everybody's life. From a warm close culture to a culture where nobody was allowed to shake each other's hands or come close to each other. Fortunately the Corona did not have the same impact in Cameroon as it was in the Netherlands. The Netherlands is still in Lock down while Cameroon has started to live the normal life again. But the Anglophone crisis is still going on what gives the team in Cameroon many challenges. But safety comes first. Despite the Corona Virus, the year was full of projects and help given to many children. A project like the Prison Project was put on hold for some months. But it didn't mean that the organization had nothing to do. Besides the individual help we also had a very big project going on. The Ejed Maternity was completely renovated so that the Young Teenage Pregnant Girls Project could start.

The Foundation is getting really known in Kumba and the direct villages around. More and more people know where to find the office to seek for help. The Foundation is still organized in a basically simple way in order to be able to give direct support to the local population in groups as well as individually. We help children at the time and place of direct needs. In this way we can build a relationship with the child and the family so as to make sure quality of care and support we offer is optimal. After support has been given we stay in direct contact with the child to ensure that our goals will be accomplished. Also the Prison and Orphanages Projects are direct and personal.

With our team in Cameroon we accomplish a lot of goals and carry out a lot of projects and help. However, it is impossible to fulfill all the projects without the help we get from volunteers and contributors from the Netherlands. Besides of the individuals there are also companies that put in effort in the Foundation and can be relied on in the future. Off course this does not happen by itself, the Foundation puts a lot of efforts in finding publicity. We made the newspapers several times and events were organized. The team in the Netherlands, led by Liesbeth van Elderen, managed fundraising by organizing flea markets, fairs, presentations, clothing parties, and so on. Also in Best and the direct villages the foundation is really known. People often come bring clothes and toys for the children in Cameroon. We mostly send it to Cameroon but since it is so much we also sell them in the shop in Best. Everything we earn from that goes directly to the Foundation. Unfortunately it is more difficult to raise money now because of the shops that are closed and no markets or fairs are taking place. Most of the selling happens now online and we had some generous donors who helped us this year.

Since 2016 the situation in Cameroon is dangerous because of strikes and killings going on. Some areas in the South West of Cameroon are so dangerous that even the Foundation can't go there anymore. Because of this reason, the President of the Foundation, Kim van Elderen, has not been visiting Cameroon since 2016. The team in Cameroon has been constantly in contact with the President so that she is involved in all the projects going on.

In this Annual Report we want to give an overview of what the Foundation did during this year on the side of projects, fund raising and of course the finances in detail. Apart from that we will take a short preview in 2021. Needs For Children is an open Foundation and that is the reason why all finances are explained in detail.

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Needs For Children

The Foundation started on 17th October 2011 in Best. The idea originated from Kim van Elderen. Since 2009 she has been traveling regularly to Cameroon to work on a voluntary basis as a nurse in the Ejed Medical Foundation, Kumba-Cameroon. Her experiences have shown her that the children in and around Kumba need a lot of help. Before she started her foundation, she provided aid to children with financial help, by donating material to an orphanage and by improving the facilities of the Ejed Medical Foundation. It was not easy to do this all as an individual, so Kim started her Foundation to be able to help the children even more and to give them better opportunities in life.

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Collaborating Organizations in Cameroon

1) Ejed Medical Foundation. The hospital is now led by Medical Officer Nzume Michael. We have been collaborating with them from the beginning. In the Ejed Medical Foundation we treat our sick children and our new babies are delivered there.

2) Kumba District Hospital. The Government hospital in Kumba. They call when they need help for sick children who are admitted but cannot foot their medical bills. In collaboration with them, we look how we can help and the hospital also helps a percentage of 50%.

3) Kumba Principal Prison. The Prison in Kumba works closely together with the Foundation. Together we ensure quality of care in prison for minor prisoners. Where the Government offers no help, we will do so.

4) Ministry of Social Affairs. They are our back up. They are kept informed of the projects we do and they see where they can help. And the other way around.

5) DGRE. They protect the Foundation where necessary. They also take care that reports about the work of the NGO are written down and send to the Government in Yaoundé. This to make them know about Needs For Children.

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Fundraising

During the last year the Needs for Children Team in the Netherlands has been playing an active role in fund raising. Besides appealing to individuals and companies for sponsorship, the team has actively tried to sell clothes and shoes online. The team was limited because of the restrictions due to the COVID-19.

Needs For Children is very grateful for all their volunteers and people who help the Organization in any way they do. We thank them all for their huge effort.

Needs For Children performed within the budget. Due to COVID-19 some projects didn't take place regularly like the Prison Project and Labour Day couldn't take place. But we did an end of year feast for all the partners and that is why the budget for that exceeded. The renovation for the Maternity was sponsored. With the teenage pregnant girls program we figured out that donors often get attached to the case they help and they continue their help after birth. The costs were not in the budget of course, but the expenses are covered by Personal donors.



Projects

Next a short description of the several projects with illustrations and costs overview.

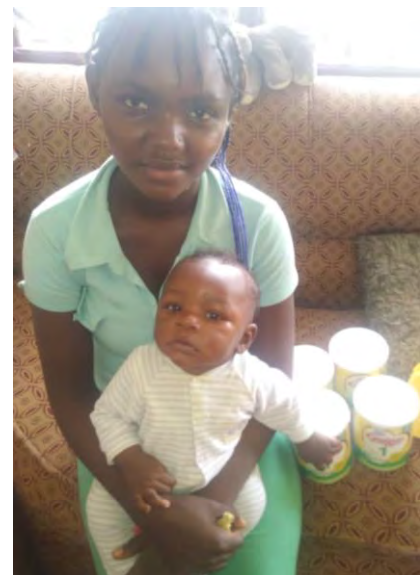
1) Medical help to children

The Foundation helps children who need medical support or need a medical tool to improve quality of life. Besides of that the Foundation has become a place for other organizations to search for help in case they lack the resources for helping a child. We study a child's situation with the whole team to make a support plan. Below are the children we offered support with a short description.

Abia Destiny

Destiny is an abandoned baby the Social Affairs brought to the office in March 2020 to seek for help. He didn't take the mother's breast milk anymore so that is why the mother abandoned the child to run to Douala to look for work. A guardian took the child and decided to take the baby to the office to plead for help for milk supply to the baby. Destiny was supplied 4 tins Guigoz 1 milk for 2 weeks. The mother (17 years) came back to look for her child and met the child with a guardian. She was happy with the help which was given. He came to the office when he was 1 month 2 weeks and we gave him milk for 3 months 2 weeks until he was 6 months old. We left him sound and healthy.

Ahone Mercy



Dr Michael from Ejed Clinic called our attention on the 17th of March 2020 for Medical Help to a 16 year old girl. She was suffering from cerebral malaria and was treated at Ejed Clinic. We helped her several times with the hospital bill since she often had a rendezvous. But after April we couldn't determine if she was fine because she left the town without our knowledge.

Amate Stephanie

We met Stephanie on the 19th of February 2020 at the District Hospital Kumba. She is 15 years old and an Internally Displaced Person from Bangem residing at Alaska Street. She was diagnosed of septic arthritis and she was malnourished. Her treatment began immediately and she was operated on her knees. Three weeks later, she was discharged feeling already good.

Antene Godwin

Godwin, 13 years, came to the office with his mother and sister to plead for medical help. He suffered from high fever, chest pain, head ache etc. We made him to consult at Ejed Clinic. After consultation and lab test were done, he was diagnosed with typhoid fever. This is a bacterial infection due to a specific type of salmonella that causes symptoms. Godwin received treatment for this sickness.

Antene Precious

The sister of Godwin, Antene also came with them to the office. She is 17 years and was suffering from body itches, ring worms, wounds on her legs and cough. She was also send to consult at Ejed Clinic. After consultation and lab tests were done, she was placed on treatment for infections.

The Abigail Lum

Since 2013 the Foundation helps Abigail. Now she is 11 years and has improved a lot. Before she couldn't stand, talk, walk or see. Now she can walk, talk clearly, sing, and can easily identify members of the Needs For Children team each time she is visited. The Foundation is visiting her every month with foodstuff. This to help the mum who is partially blinded herself. Even though the mother too has improved greatly because Abigail is no longer dirty or abandoned to herself. We thank God that each passing year, our help to her is not in vain. From a bizarre language to normal clean Pidgin English; Abigail has amazed so many people. She received 11 visits last year with each month supply of rice, groundnuts, diapers, beverages, garri, plantain, coco-yams etc. It was only in December that we omitted somethings to buy her Christmas dresses and shoes. We can conclude by saying that Abigail has improved so much and she is even growing in height.

Chembeng Emmanuel Stephan

The 4 year old Emmanuel came to the office together with his mother. They pleaded for medical help since Emmanuel is suffering from swollen testis. This started since he was 3 months old. He has been operated before on it but it started swelling again after a few months. His father died when he was 3 years so since that time there was no money to follow up on him again. That is why they came for help. We send Emmanuel to see Dr. Mike Nzume to make a treatment plan. He was booked for an operation the next month. Unfortunately they never showed up for the operation. So the only help we rendered to him was lab tests conducted on him.

Daniel Samuel

This 5 months old baby was admitted in the District Hospital, suffering from malaria and anemia. He was there with his mum and grandmother but they didn't have any means to take care of the baby. The baby was first treated in the village with traditional treatment to no avail. That is why they came to Kumba but didn't have money. We decided to help the baby with the necessary tests and treatment. After 5 days Daniel was fully recovered.

Fossack Joseph

This 2 year old boy was admitted in District Hospital with fever, convulsions and meningitis. They came from Small Masaka village and tried already a lot before we stepped in. The drugs for the treatment was difficult to find in Kumba so we had to make the drugs come from Douala (3 hours away). We made everything possible to get all the treatment. After one month he was discharged, healthy but he was left with a deformity. He has to keep going to the physiotherapy.

Kadji Leonel

She is one of our Individual Kids we have been helping since 2015. This time around, she came to the office with the mum to plead for medical help since she falls a lot due to convulsion. She came in with wounds on the face. We decided to supply Tegretol for the whole year to make sure she doesn't fall from the convulsions again. As the year ended, Leonel is feeling much better. We will continue the help as well in 2021.

Kambi Zadock

The 12 year old Zadock was in need of an operation and asked our help. He had multiple abscesses all over his body. The doctor in charged said that Zadock is suffering from hematogenous spread infection. We helped him with the treatment and operation. Two weeks later he left the hospital feeling fine.

Lilian Nage

We have been helping Lilian for years now. But now Lilian is older than our target group. Because of this crisis in the Anglophone zones and the accident Lilian's mother had sometimes ago, it has been difficult for her to take care of Lilian. She pleaded to create a small business for her so that she could continue taking care of Lilian. We decided to make her a small business in front of her house where she could sell foodstuff. We stock her whole business. Unfortunately 2 months later, we went to take stock and learn that she had gone to the village with Lilian to live with her sick husband.

Miki Patrick

On the 14th of February we organized a Children's meeting. Patrick, who we helped some years ago, didn't attend and later we heard that he had an accident and broke his arm. The team visited him. In the end of the year he came to the office to tell us he is to attend school. We helped him with some school stuff, this is to encourage the mother for keeping up the good care.

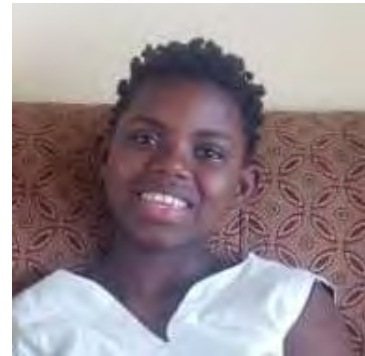

Nabila Joyce

It was two years ago that we sent Joyce to the deaf school in Kumba. The Anglophone crisis had sent Joyce and her family from mbalangi to Mbanga. So there was no way to go to school and beside that the school was closed because of the crisis. But last September school opened again and Joyce came back to Kumba. She came to the office with the mother to plead if she can go back to school. And of course she can start school again, as from the beginning of 2021.

Njume Success

Njume, 12 years, came to the office with the father to plead for medical help. He had pains on his left side, swollen testis on and off. After consultation he was first treated for malaria. He was later followed up to see if the hernia will show up. It finally showed up and he was operated at Ejed Clinic. After 3 days he was discharged and already feeling well.

Rikia Bright

Rikia was just a few days old when we met her. She is the daughter of an epileptic young girl. This girl found out late that she was pregnant. Due to her convulsions she was often taken advantage of and that is how she got HIV. The mother could not breastfeed the child because of her status. Besides that, she is handicapped on one hand. Rikia's help from us started with some basic needs and continued with 4 tins of Guigoz 1 per 2 weeks. Until the grand-mother came and took her to the village without our notice, Rikia had collected 5 consignments of milk. Her help just ended like that since they were nowhere to be found.

Ron Miracle

Ron is the 1st child of our Teenage Pregnant Girl Project. He was delivered on the 27th of August 2019 and fell sick of jaundice on the 1st of September 2019. He was brought to the District hospital and after 6 days he was completely fine and discharged from the hospital on the 9th of September 2019. When the time to walk came, he could not stand on his own. That's why we came in again to help and we took him to the Rehabilitation Center at the District Hospital. After the 3 months requested by the Physiotherapist, he is still unable to walk alone but can creep speedily with the stomach. Also this year we will keep an eye on him.

Triplets Marceline

We were called at the District Hospital Kumba to render help to the triplets babies of Marceline. Marceline is a 25 year old girl who is deaf and lives in the bush because their house was burnt down. The father of the triplets did not want to take any responsibility. The babies were born premature with 31 weeks. We came in on the 16th July 2020, when the babies were one day old, with treatment and milk. Days later, we brought them babies' needs and gave them. On the 5th of August one of the babies died while being on blood transfusion. It was on the 26th of August that Marceline and her two babies were discharged. We feel bad that one baby died but we are happy that we have been of help to the other two babies (boy and girl).

Twin Sakwe Godwin and Godgift

The 27 year old mother seeks for help from the organization. She delivered the twins in the bush alone. The father of the twins died before delivery. The 4 months old twins were constantly vomiting and losing weight. At the District Hospital, they asked our help for lab tests, treatment and artificial milk. and having running stomach. The President gave the permission to help them with F75, Lab tests and artificial milk. After one month they looked more healthy and their weight had increased.

Twin Wase and Ngwe

The twin were brought to the office by their aunt because their mother Pauline, 23 years, died after operation of the twins of preeclampsia. When they came to the office the twin was just a few days old. They pleaded for milk. Immediately the supply of milk began and continued for 2 months for the both of them.

During the visit for the 4th consignment, we were as disappointed as we met the boy. On enquiry, we learn that the girl child had passed away and was buried. We saw only pictures. We waited again for them to come and take the boy's milk but no one came. Our entire attempt to get to them failed.

Hannah

On 12th august 2020 Hannah gave birth to a baby girl with the name Kim Maria.

Hannah has been close to the Organization since we helped her sister Lydia. Unfortunately she died in 2018. Even after then Hannah is always present whenever we organize something or we need help.

She also helped Kim during her stay in Cameroon with her baby Indy.

We are so happy to receive the news that Hannah and her husband welcomed their own baby. And Kim is feeling very proud that the baby is carrying her name.

Rejoice Blessing

She is the hydrocephalus case we started treating in July 2019 and was operated in November 2019. Her rendezvous was to be in January 2020 but we were called before the day that she has not been eating for 4 days now and has started breathing faster. We called the Doctor and he asked them to come the next day but she died on the 18th of January 2020 at 3:00 am just as they were preparing to go to the hospital in Buea. R.I.P.

Baby Chris Esake

The first case of the year was the case of baby Chris Esake. He was just a few weeks old and suffering from jaundice, infections and high temperature. District Hospital Kumba called us if we could assist since the mother did not have any means. She is 19 years old and delivered Chris in the bush around Matcho village. The village was attacked and her boyfriend was killed. She delivered the baby under unhygienic circumstances. We started our help on the 8th of January. He was placed on treatment and light therapy. Unfortunately he died on the 15th of January. R.I.P.

Ngum Sandra

The two year old girl Sandra was our last case of the year 2020. She was suffering from tetanus. The parents tried all they could but asked for help from us because they didn't have any money left. We saw the effort the parents had put in and started helping them immediately. Unfortunately she died 3 weeks after we started our help. R.I.P.

2) Prison

At least once a month the team of Needs For Children visits the young inmates between 0 and 21 years old in the prison. In order to give them the feeling that we are there for them and that there is a group who put their efforts to help them. Every month we give them education about a subject that the children and young adults want to know more about. We also bring them things they need, like soap, slippers, medication, towels etc. Beside that we motivate them to make hand crafts and to sell them. We teach them new creative hand crafts. To buy this from them, they remain motivated. Needs For Children works closely with

the warders to make this project go smoothly.

Unfortunately the Prison Project was not carried out for all the months because of the Corona Virus. Instead of the 11 or 12 visits per year, we were only allowed to have 6 visits. Because of the barrier measures given to prevent the spread of the Corona Virus, the Prison visit was hampered for 6 months (May to October). It was only in November that Prison doors were opened to receive visitors. When the messages got to our ears and those of the President, she asked us to visit immediately and it was done so. It was so unfortunate that we met the inmates with so many requests and pleas. We responded positively to it and they received some of their basic needs in December as their own Christmas gifts.

3) Orphanages

As it is our routine, the children of various Orphanages in Kumba were not forgotten. Due to the Covid-19 and the Anglophone crisis it was hard to keep going there regularly, but on the 15th of December 2020, we visited 4 Orphanages (Azi, Frathekk, Clephic and Mahdi) in Kumba. Each of them received red oil, rice, groundnuts and soy beans. All of them were happy and appreciated the Organization for her kindness towards orphans.



We also replaced the monument vault at Azi Orphanage because it has worn out due to sun and rain.

4) Day of the African Child

But next year we will organize a special day on youth day again since at the Day of the African Child a lot of help comes at once.

6) Teenage Pregnant Girls Project

It's a project to help teenage girls who are pregnant and cannot take care of their antenatal till delivery. In this project, we are in partnership with Ejed Medical Foundation Kumba where they take care of the pre-drugs and we take care of lab tests, delivery fees, post drugs and the baby's first needs.



Yaya Faith (Noah Henry)

Yaya was 16 years when she became pregnant. She is an orphan who lived with her aunt. Unfortunately the aunt send her out of the house when she discovered that she was 7 months pregnant. And that is how our community worker found her begging people for a place to sleep. The father of the baby ran away because he was afraid of being locked up. Yaya was left alone, stopped going to school and had no money to attend antenatal preparation. We decided to make her attend the project and begged her aunty to take her back in the house. On the 18th of April she gave birth to a bouncing baby boy named: Noah Henry.

Baby Noah Henry has a private sponsor who gives them every month foodstuff. And when necessary he can be treated in the hospital on her cost. 557 900 cfa = € 851,76



Eboho Ophilia

A girl, 21 years, who was brought to us by the midwife. She lives with her mother since the boyfriend didn't take care of her. She started with the follow up in our maternity immediately since she was already 7 months pregnant. Unfortunately she didn't put to birth in our maternity but somebody send her to another hospital on the day of delivery.

Bali Lover (Lily Beau)

She is 21 years and she comes from Ekondo-titi road. When she discovered she was pregnant of her fourth baby she came to Kumba to live with her cousin. Her boyfriend with whom she got pregnant for their second child left her alone. When we started our help she was already 7 months pregnant. On the 20th June 2020 she delivered a healthy baby girl named: Lily Beau.

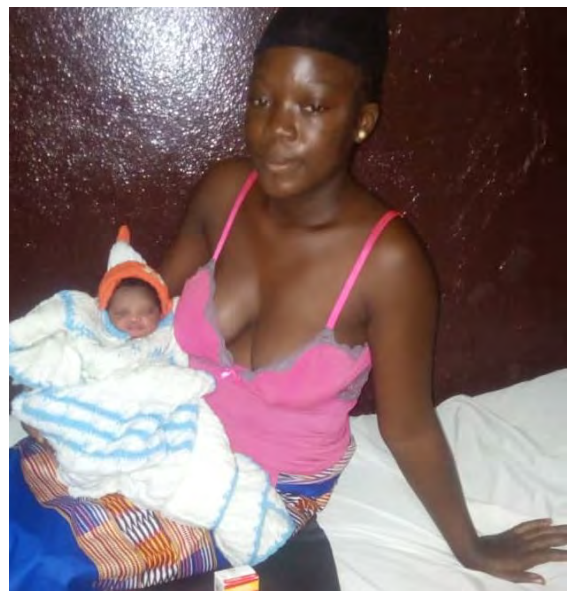

The 16 years old Esther came to the office with the aunt to plead for help as concerns her pregnancy. She was 5 months pregnant when she came and we immediately started her ANC visit. The boy who impregnated her was nowhere to be found. And Esther was drove out of the house by her father and stepmother. With 36 weeks she put to birth on the 4th October 2020 to a baby girl. The baby was in good health. She named the baby: Theresia Ayankoh

Che Alma

Alma is a 16 years old girl who was 2 months pregnant. The mother of Alma came to the office to plead for help since the author of the pregnancy was nowhere to be found. She started her antenatal on the 16th of June 2020. All was going well until the 6th of September when she woke up and was crying that she wants to poo. She had already seen blood flowing so a neighbor rushed her to the clinic and called Marie who came immediately after the call. Thank God the midwife also came later and she put to birth safely. Unfortunately the baby boy was already death before birth.

78 500 cfa = € 119,85

We deeply feel sorry for the loss. A few months later Alma also lost her twin sister who was shot to death in the classroom together with her other classmates. It was a very low point in the whole Anglophone crisis.

Binta Enema

She is 20 years old and lives with her aunty who happens to be the new eye specialist of Ejed Clinic. She is 4 months pregnant and we made her to start the antenatal care. She is still to put to birth. She had an ultrasound on the 2nd visit and it showed that her placenta is already matured. She should be careful not to do any hard work else the baby can come before his time.

1. *Expected Projects*

*** Medical support to children:**

Focus more on providing medical support to individual children. With the crisis going on, many children have ran together with their families leaving their villages because of the danger. So it is difficult to trace them. When they get sick they often don't have the resources to go to a hospital. We want to help those children. However we will draw a clear limit to how far we help. It is expected that the families will also contribute a percentage. In order to have more chances of success.

*** Prison Project:**

Visit the prison every month to offer them lectures and help. Besides that, we want to help the minor inmates whenever they are sick and need treatment outside of the prison.

*** Orphanages:**

Keep on supporting the orphanages in and around Kumba, in every possible way.

*** Youth Day:**

A day to bring all the children together we have ever helped. This to see how they are doing and to give them a nice happy day together.

*** Maternity Renovation Project:**

We still need a better echo machine. Hopefully we can make it happen in 2021.

*** Teenage Pregnant Girls Program:**

2020 we started off good. In collaboration with Ejed Clinic we will follow up the girls during their whole pregnancy with lab tests, checkups and echography. We will also do the delivery and take care of all the costs. The girls will be sent home with full equipments for the baby. We have to keep up this work in 2021 and attract more girls so they can deliver safely.

*** Apart from these projects the Needs for Children Foundation also offers materials to children who need it. This can vary from clothes to toys, and so on. For this reason we try to send the materials we receive from people from the Netherlands as much as possible to Cameroon so the Foundation can distribute it.**

There are much more possible projects next to the mentioned ones but we try to look at the specific needs at every moment. Needs for Children is synonymous for small scale projects!
